Octavia Hatcher gave birth to her first child in 1891. But the baby died, and Octavia fell into a funk and then a coma. Doctors pronounced her dead, and because it was a hot day her husband had her buried immediately. Soon, other folks in Pikeville fell into comas. Realizing she might have just looked dead, her husband James Hatcher, had her coffin exhumed. Oops.

Take a photo of Octavia Hatcher's grave (the woman standing on the obelisk base).

Follow US-23 into Pikesville following US-23 Bus and the Pikeville College Campus. Enter Cemetery Road adjacent to the Physical Plant building and make a right into the cemetery. Mrs Hatcher's grave is located in the fenced in area at the right angle turn - her back is facing you. If the gate is locked, take a photo of her back. GPS: 37.48102, -082.52028

In 1642 Massachusetts hired two surveyors, Nathaniel Woodward and Solomon Saffery, to survey the boundary between that colony and Connecticut. However, the point they established as the western end of the line was disputed by Connecticut and ultimately found to be eight miles too far south. Since then, this area has been under dispute and has changed states several times- currently, the Southwick Jog is in Massachusetts.

Adjacent to VFW Post 872, you will find two similarly titled street signs: Two States Ave & Two States Road. Take a picture so that both signs are visible.

Purchase a 4 oz or larger jar of Raye's Mustard from the Raye's Mustard Mill store; retain your receipt. The jar must be turned in at scoring, unopened and intact, along with the receipt. If you'd like a jar as well, buy two.

According to Smiler Nate Etheridge, “every New Year’s Eve, the acorn is moved to the roof of the Raleigh Civic Center and is ‘dropped’ at midnight as the North Carolina equivalent to the big apple/ball that drops in Times Square at the same time. ‘Why an acorn,’ one may ask? Well, Raleigh is known as ‘The City of Oaks’”.

Take a picture of the large acorn located in Moore Square.

I-40/440 exit 298, north 1.75 miles on US-70/US-401, right on W. Martin St (turns to E. Martin St). Travel east 3 blocks, acorn is in Moore Square. GPS: 35.77697, -078.63663

The “Lindbergh of Mexico”, Emilio Carranza Rodriguez, will forever be bound to this patch of forest in the New Jersey Pine Barrens. Flying an identical copy of the Spirit of St Louis, Carranza was to fly roundtrip from Mexico City to New York City.

The trip to New York was done in stages and went smoothly. But the return flight was going to be a non-stop, grueling test of endurance. Carranza delayed his departure for three days because of bad weather, and then abruptly flew off on the evening of July 12, 1928, in a wild thunderstorm and history.

Take a photo of the Carranza Memorial - please make sure the Phoenix is visible.

Take NJ-70 to Red Lion Circle and turn south on US-206. After one mile, turn left onto Carranza Rd. Drive for about nine miles. The Memorial will be visible on the right. GPS: 39.78331, -074.65088

**7) Brooklyn, NY                      Daylight                      HACK                      72 points**

Arguably the greatest chase scene in cinema history ended here at the 62nd-New Utrecht Station. Starting at the Bay-50th Station near Coney Island, Popeye Doyle (Gene Hackman) raced the overhead train through the streets of Bensonhurst. Much of the chase scene was shot live without the use of extras (the bystanders were real).

One of the cars Gene Hackman strikes was not supposed to be part of the sequence but was left in the final edit; it was owned by a Brooklynite who drove into the path of the oncoming movie crew.

Take a photo of the front of the station.

62nd Street & New Utrecht Avenue, Brooklyn, NY. From I-278, ride north on Fort Hamilton Pkwy. Turn right on 62nd Street to the station just east of New Utrecht on the right. GPS: 40.62638, -073.99689

**8) Port Milford, ON      24 hours      FDIL      237 points**

The original False Duck Island Lighthouse was built in 1829 on False Duck Island offshore. In 1905, the lighthouse was struck by lightning and just about destroyed the tower. It was later replaced in 1965 by an automated modern steel light. False Duck Island light is currently located in Mariner's Memorial Park.

Locate the large mural called "Gold Cup Races Long Reach". What is the "world's speed record" for Miss Supertest III?

This area was set aside to house the French Royals in case of a revolution.

Take a photo of the Asylum Memorial located at the corner of Queens Road and SR2014.

Look for a small glade on the north side of the road near the Grout Pond Trail. The Appalachian Trail also crosses near here. In the glade, stands a large stone with an imbedded tablet commemorating the Whig Party's big party.

Take a photo of the Webster Memorial.

From Arlington, ride east on East Arlington St about 7 miles. From West Wardsboro, ride west on Arlington-Stratton Rd for about 5 miles. GPS: 43.05965, -072.95977

In 1966, ever-progressive Mississippi got around to repealing Prohibition. There's a historical marker to commemorate the event.

Get a receipt from the northernmost Waffle House. Receipt must have "WAFFLE HOUSE" printed on it along with the name of the town *or* the address *or* the store number.

Take a photo of the sculpture "Let There Be Light" marking the grave of Isaac Wolfe Bernheim. What do the two granite pylons represent?

The Stinson Sardine cannery was the last sardine cannery operating in the US. The cannery was marked for years by a giant figure of a fisherman in a yellow slicker holding a giant can of sardines. The cannery was recently bought by a lobster processing company, who revamped the Stinson Sardine man to reflect their own trade.

Get a photo of the Stinson Sardine / lobster man.

In 1958, the U.S. Air Force accidentally dropped an atomic bomb (sans the core of fissionable material) on the small town of Mars Bluff, SC, destroying the home of Mr. Walter Gregg. It is said that the crater is still visible today. Oops, sorry.

Take a photo of the historical marker commemorating the U.S. Air Force's bombing of America. In what material was Mr. Gregg's house sided?

President Andrew Johnson's grave is located on top of Monument Hill in the Andrew Johnson National Cemetery.

The road to the top of Monument Hill is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The walking path to the top of Monument Hill is open 24 hours.

According to legend, the colonial-era founder of Bucksport, Col. Jonathon Buck, burned a witch and her leg rolled out of the bonfire. The deformed son of the witch cursed Col. Buck to be haunted forever by the sight of his mother's leg. After Buck died, his heirs erected a monument on his grave site. Shortly thereafter, the mysterious outline of a woman's stockinged leg appeared on Buck's tomb. For 300 years, Buck's descendants tried to remove the marking with water, soap, acid, chemicals, and sandblasting, but the stain would always reappear. And you can see it haunting Buck's tomb to this very day!

Actually, not very much of that is true. There was a Colonel Jonathan Buck, he founded the town, he's buried in this cemetery, but not under the monument. No witches were ever burned in the US, witch trials had stopped before Col. Buck was born, and no witch was ever put on trial in Maine. But the mark of the leg is still visible!!!!

Take a photo of the mark of the leg on Col. Buck's monument. We will also accept a photo of either of the markers explaining the "Legend of the Buck Monument" or the large colorful "Jonathan Buck Monument" sign. But try to get the mark of the leg on the monument, it's spooky!!!!

Glenn Curtiss was a bicycle and motorcycle racer in the early 1900s. He set a motorcycle speed record of 64 mph in 1903, and became known as “the fastest man in the world” when he rode a V-8 motorcycle to 136 mph in 1907. Curtiss then shifted his attention to aviation. He established the first US military flight school, invented the seaplane, invented the flying boat, developed the first airplane to land on a ship, and sold thousands of his Jenny biplanes, essentially creating the American aviation industry.

Take a photo of the “Cradle of Aviation” historical marker. What was the date of the flight?

Take a photo of the historical marker. According to the marker, where was the birthday party?

In 1827 he returned and delivered them to Joseph Smith, who published them as the Book of Mormon. On this site, at the top of Hill Cumorah, is a golden statue of the Angel Moroni.

The Moroni Monument stands at the summit of Hill Cumorah. Take a photo of the Monument from the top of the Hill. Even though the Monument is visible from the bottom of the Hill and surrounding areas, you must go to the top of the Hill and take a photo from there.

Barre Vermont is the home of extraordinarily talented granite sculptors. These artists have a tradition of expressing their art in their own gravestones. You could spend a whole day riding around being amazed at the sculpture here, and with some luck you’ll see some. We want you to find one in particular - the Cassavoy marker.

Take a photo of the Cassavoy marker with the illustration on it

From the entrance to Hope Cemetery, take the first left after the entrance. Follow the road past a maple leaf shaped marker. Go to the 4th row of hedges. At the road on the left is a marker for “Stonecliff”. The third marker to the left of Stonecliff is Cassavoy.
