Get a receipt from Woodward OK.

**6)    Fort Collins, CO                24 hours                    ANIG                    127 points**

In 1934 local railroad men found a sick, pregnant dog nearby and nursed her back to health. From then until her death in 1948, Annie the Railroad Dog stayed with her benefactors, daily greeting trains at the freight depot and passengers arriving at the nearby passenger station. When Annie died, the C&S men laid her to rest near the freight depot and placed a cement marker on her grave.

Take a photo of the marker on the grave of Annie the Railroad Dog.

After the Mormons were expelled from Independence MO, they settled in this area. Caldwell County was created for them, with Far West as the county seat. As many as 5000 members of the LDS church settled in Far West. Anti-Mormon feelings escalated to all-out war between the Mormons and non-Mormon state government. The Mormons lost, and were forced to sign over their property to the state and flee to exile in Nauvoo, Illinois.

Take a photo of the three-part monument that starts "FAR WEST A CONSECRATED AND HOLY LAND".

The Temple Lot was the first site to be set aside for a Latter Day Saints temple as the heart of the new City of Zion. The lot is currently the headquarters of the Chruch of Christ (Temple Lot), which refuses to let the LDS Church, the RLDS Church (who built the Independence Temple across the street), or any other organization build on the lot or buy it.

Take a photo of the blue "Temple Site" historical marker.

**20) Detroit, MI                      24 hours                      SONH                      694 points**

Eddie James "Son" House was one of the pioneering Mississippi Delta blues musicians. Born near the crossroads at Clarksdale, at 15 he became a preacher, and in his 20s he killed a man and was sent to the Mississippi State Penitentiary at Parchman Farm. When he got out he moved to Lula MS and started playing gigs with Charley Patton, Willie Brown and Robert Johnson. Fading into obscurity, by the 1940s he was working as a railroad porter on the New York Central and retired from music. During the blues-folk revival of the 1960s, Son House was rediscovered and spent several years touring the US and Europe with the likes of Bukka White, Skip James and Buddy Guy. He has been cited as a musical influence on the Rolling Stones, Canned Heat, the White Stripes, and Depeche Mode. Married five times, Son House died in Detroit at the age of 86 or 102, depending on which story you believe.

John Wesley Powell, daring one-armed explorer of the Colorado River, named Flaming Gorge for the light reflecting off the red rocks at sunset.

Take a photo of the small silver “Flaming Gorge Reservoir” interpretive marker at the scenic overlook.

About one mile south of Dutch John on US 191, at the scenic overlook approx. 1/5th mile west of US 191. GPS: 40.92072, -109.42275

Clifton was the first townsite surveyed in the US section of the North Shore of Lake Superior.

Take a photo of the Clifton-French River historical marker

It’s said that nearly every town in Canada has a Canadian Legion War Memorial.

Take a photo of the plaque at the base of the Marathon Canadian Legion war memorial. Make sure we can clearly read that the memorial was erected by Marathon Branch No. 183 Royal Canadian Legion.

**24) Verendrye, ND      24 hours      THOM      371 points**

David Thompson was the first to map this area. His maps were later used by the Lewis and Clark Expedition.

Take a photo of the David Thompson Monument, a large granite globe which stands atop a large granite base in a grassy area a short distance off of 49th St N.

49th St N/CR 2536. To reach this remote location using the minimum amount of gravel roads: Go west from Hwy 14 on 48th St NE (there’s a sign there pointing to Karlsruhe). Eight miles down this paved road is an intersection where another sign points left to Karlsruhe, but at this point you need to turn right onto 2nd Ave N (gravel). In less than a mile the road will curve left (turning into 49th St N. or CR 2536) and a sign will indicate the monument is six more miles. The monument will be on the left a short distance off the road, just as it starts to descend into the Souris River valley. GPS: 48.12240, -100.74977

**25) Thunder Bay, ON      Daylight      TFOX      449 points**

Terry Fox is a national hero of Canada. Three years after losing a leg to cancer, he began the Marathon of Hope to raise money for cancer awareness. Starting at the Atlantic Ocean near St. John Newfoundland, he ran the equivalent of a marathon every day for almost 5 months, on one leg and a crude artificial limb. Crowds and attention grew and money began to pour in. Near Thunder Bay, he found he couldn't go on - the cancer had spread to his lungs - and he ended his run. He died several months later. Since then, the annual Terry Fox run has raised over \$500 million for cancer research. Across Canada, there are 32 roads, 14 schools, 14 other buildings, 9 fitness trails, 7 statues, a mountain, and a Coast Guard ship dedicated to Terry Fox.

Take a photo of the statue of Terry Fox.

The Grand Portage National Monument preserves a portage over the Northern Continental Divide used by the voyageurs in the fur trade.

Find the interpretive sign titled "Grand Portage: Naming This Place" which stands in front of the Heritage Center, overlooking Lake Superior: Who drew the map and when? (Answer is in the lower left corner of the sign).

We love geography. So we want you to go to the exact center of the northern half of the western hemisphere (sort of exact, anyway) at 45 degrees north latitude, 90 degrees west longitude.

**30) Muscatine, IA                      Sunrise to 10 p.m.                      TWOV                      122 points**

The Mark Twain Overlook is the former site of Muscatine's first radio station, KTNT (Know The Naked Truth) operated by Norman C. Baker from 1925-1931. Baker was an inventor and a self-proclaimed doctor. Despite having no formal training or degrees, he claimed to be able to cure cancer without operations or radiation. He was convicted of federal mail fraud in 1940.

Take a photo of the Mark Twain Overlook marker.

**31) Harrison, AR                      24 hours                      CARA                      150 points**

Caravan Spring was the starting point for a caravan of emigrants headed for California in 1857, who were later massacred at Mountain Meadows, UT by Mormons disguised as Indians.

Approx. five miles south of Harrison on Highway 7. GPS: 36.17590, -93.12342

I.C. and Cornelia White Sutton founded the village of Lurton, AR

Walk right past that bust of Laura Ingalls Wilder and find the monument to Carl Mays, baseball star and notoriously surly guy. What the monument doesn't tell you is what Carl Mays was most famous for: in a game in 1920, Mays threw a pitch that hit batter Ray Chapman in the head and killed him.

On what day did Mays pitch two nine-inning complete games for the Red Sox?

At the wayside off Hwy 94 there is a large stone teepee with bronze plaques affixed.

**36) Brimley, MI      Daylight      PIRQ      600 points**

This iconic and historic lighthouse on Lake Superior marks the division line between Whitefish Bay and the western end of the St. Marys River, the connection between Lake Superior and other Great Lakes.

Take a photo of the lighthouse including the tower.

**37) Nauvoo, IL      Daylight      SMTH      221 points**

Joseph Smith, founder of the LDS movement, and his brother Hyrum were jailed in nearby Carthage on charges that Joseph, as Mayor of Nauvoo, had ordered the destruction of an anti-Mormon newspaper. An angry mob of men with painted faces broke into the jail and shot Joseph and Hyrum to death. They are considered martyrs by the Mormon church.

Take a photo of the statue of the two Smiths mounted on their horses.

N Wells St, just off Hwy 96, on the grounds across the street from the Mormon Tabernacle. GPS: 40.55078, -091.38512

**38) Eureka Springs, AR      24 hours      JES3      300 points**

At 67 feet tall, this is the 3rd tallest statue of Jesus in the world! It should be easy to distinguish from any other tall statues of Jesus that may have been erected nearby: an art critic said it was similar to "a milk carton with a tennis ball stuffed on its top" and locals and Arkansans sometimes refer to it as "Our Milk Carton With Arms".

According to the Mormon faith, this place, Adam-ondi-Ahman, is where Adam and Eve lived after they were kicked out of the Garden of Eden. It is where the priesthood and the righteous people will meet just before the Second Coming. So if there's a big crowd when you get here . . .

Find the small marker with gold lettering which stands about 195 yards walk from the parking area; the text begins with "On 19 May 1838, a surveying party..." According to this marker, what did Joseph Smith organize here on 28 June 1838 and who was the president?

Hwy 13, approx. three miles south of Jameson. From the entrance on Hwy 13: go right on the gravel road for 2.9 mi to the parking area for the Tower Hill Overlook; the marker is a 195-yard walk from the parking area. GPS: 39.97180, -093.98347

Fortunately for you, the show is closed during the rally, or you'd have to go see it. So, simply go to the theater and take a photo of the giant sign for "Mickey Gilley Theatre" showing the giant SIX on it.

**46) Hamtramck, MI      24 hours      HMTR      650 points**

Retired GM assembly line worker Dmytro Szyrak built an assemblage of folk art that the neighborhood knows as Hamtramck Disneyland. It’s spectacularly weird.

***Warning - this is a residential neighborhood and you will be a matter of a few feet from where people are living and sleeping. Don’t be a rude idiot, especially if you go there at night. Be quiet and respectful, for your sake and for the sake of the riders arriving behind you. Also, because people in this neighborhood might kick your ass if you bother them.***

Take a photo of Hamtramck Disneyland showing the yellow and blue picket fence.

**48) Paducah, KY                      24 hours                      SEA1                      302 points**

In 1804-06, Meriwether Lewis and William Clark led the Corps of Discovery Expedition up the Missouri River from near St. Louis to its headwaters, across the Rocky Mountains, and on to the Pacific Ocean. Among the members of the expedition was a black Newfoundland dog named Seaman, the only animal to survive the entire trip. According to the plaque at this site, in 1803 Lewis paid \$20.00 for Seaman but in 1827 William Clark paid only a \$5.00 transfer fee for the land where Paducah now stands.

Take a photo of the sculpture showing Seaman. Taking artistic license, George Lundeen added what to the map held by William Clark?

**49) Kansas City, MO                      24 hours                      SEA2                      301 points**

On their journey, Lewis and Clark stopped here. Clark observed that this spot had "a commanding situation for a fort".

Take a photo of the sculpture of Lewis, Clark, York, Sacagawea, and Seaman in the turnaround at Case Park, showing Seaman.

Take a photo of the statue of Lewis, Clark and Seaman at the Lewis & Clark Interpretive Center.

**53) Fort Calhoun, NE                      7 a.m. to 7 p.m.                      SEA6                      352 points**

Lewis and Clark held their first Indian council near here in 1804. Also, Clark celebrated his birthday here on August 1, for which he “order’d a Saddle of fat Vennison, an Elk fleece & a Bevertail to be cooked and a Desert of Cheries, Plumbs, Rasberries, Currents and grapes of a Supr. Quality”.

In Fort Atkinson State Historical Park there are statues of Lewis and Clark meeting with Native Americans while Seaman lounges nearby. The statues are located a short walk (at most a short city block in distance) on a paved path northwest of the visitor center. The path begins by the sign which reads “Lewis & Clark Council Bluff Monument - First Council Sculpture.”

Take a photo of the group of statues showing Seaman.
