Thank you for joining us this weekend. We are here to have fun, meet new people who share a common interest and ride some great roads. (There might be a little competition factor here, too.)

Important Reminders:

- If you have a question about a bonus, call one of us. We have personally scouted every bonus in this rally book.
- Your rally flag must be visible in every photo bonus. If a bonus requires your motorcycle to be in the photo, then your rally flag AND your motorcycle must be in the photo.
- Use your scoresheet to record each bonus in the order you visit them. Bonus code, odometer, time, answer (if applicable) and points must be filled in for all claimed bonuses. When you complete all bonuses in one of the combos, fill out one of the "COMBO" lines, adding the name and the points for that combo. It's okay to cross out a line and start again on the next line.
- Answers to bonus questions need to be written exactly as they appear at the bonus. Punctuation, spelling and capital/lower case letters are all important.
- Photos may be taken using your phone or using a camera. Scorers can review photos on your phone, photos on your camera or photos on an SD card from your camera.
- Business cards and other requested material must be brought to the scoring table.
- There are no state parks or entrance fees required for any of the bonuses. However, there is one bonus where you might be inclined to make a donation. That is totally up to you.

You must return to rally headquarters by 6:00 p.m. or you will DNF. If you are going to arrive later than 6:15 p.m., please call your Rallymasters.

Do not drop out of the rally without calling us.

1472 Co. Rd. 5 (Main Street), Longville

Bruno was a free spirit and every day he would make his 4-mile trek along Hwy. 84 from his rural home into town. As Longville's "town dog," everybody loved him and they even built a statue in his honor in a small alley between two businesses. Unfortunately, on May 6, 2018, Bruno (at the age of 14) was hit and killed by a car on his way into town, but his memory and story live on. Lay your rally flag next to the Bruno statue and take a photo.

The Babinski Foundation's mission is to rescue and restore abandoned and stray animals, giving each an opportunity for a new life and loving home, through adoption and education. They will give you a business card to bring to the scoring table. For each rider that collects this bonus, your rallymasters EACH will donate 1 hour of their personal time to volunteer at this wonderful facility.

HE'S A LUMBERJACK AND THAT'S OKAY

The folklore of Paul Bunyan looms large in these parts. It seems every town in the Brainerd Lakes Area has a statue of the big guy. There's even a Paul Bunyan Scenic Byway. We picked a few of the more interesting. After all, this is the Dog Daze Rally.

AKE 47.0033 -94.7305 **75 PTS**

Hwy. 34 at the west end of Akeley

What's touted as "The World's Largest Paul Bunyan Statue" is alongside the Lake Country Scenic Byway, Hwy. 34. You can sit in Paul's hand for a photo at this location (as many have) including this Rally's mascot "Blue". Place your flag on the appendage of your choosing and take a photo of Paul.

EEE 46.3533 -94.2410 **25 PTS**

7565 Excelsior Rd., Baxter

When I was just a lad, my parents brought my brother and me to see Paul Bunyan. We were surprised when Paul greeted us using our names! Back then Paul was located where Kohl's Department store now sits at the corner of Hwy 210 and Hwy 371. In the parking lot of Kohl's near the store front you will find Paul Bunyan's footprints with the years he resided at that spot. Using your awesome math skills, how many years was Paul Bunyan in that location?

35459 Butternut Point Rd., Pequot Lakes

There's an information kiosk next to the ballpark in Ideal Township with most of the information centering on folklore around Paul Bunyan. The information kiosk mentions the names of 3 of the very first resorts in Minnesota that started here in Ideal. What are the 3 resorts mentioned?

7393 MN Hwy. 371, Brainerd

At the Brainerd Welcome Center, located a few miles south of Baxter on Hwy 371, is a fiberglass 11-1/2' tall statue of Paul Bunyan, donated by Dutch & Irma Cragun, who until recently owned Cragun's Resort on Gull Lake. Throw your flag over Paul's left boot and take a photo of the legend.

APN 46.632705 -94.321164 **30 PTS**

33039 Old Hwy. 371, Pequot Lakes (Jenkins?)

Yet another 12' tall statue of Paul Bunyan. Hang your flag on the light in front of Paul and take a photo, including the A-Pine Restaurant sign.

MINNESOTA MINING

543 POINTS

The Iron Range in Minnesota stretches approximately 175 miles from Crosby to Ely and is comprised of 3 individual ranges. Cuyuna in the south, Mesabi in the middle and Vermillion in the north. Today we are going to focus on the Cuyuna Range.

UNA 46.4729 -93.8964 **100 PTS**

23915 Cuyler Lane, Deerwood

Una was the faithful Saint Bernard companion of Cuyler Adams, who discovered the Cuyuna Iron Range. The name "Cuyuna" came about when Cuyler's wife, Virginia, combined Cuyler's first 3 letters with their dog's name Una. Una is buried on the shores of Reno Lake and his grave marker is in the driveway at the address of this bonus. Park your bike in the driveway and walk just a few feet and take a photo of the marker. The homeowners, Rob and Nancy are excited about your pending visit.

MIL 46.5362 -93.9715 **90 PTS**

26351 Milford Lake Dr., Crosby

Milford Mine Memorial Park is the site of Minnesota's worst mining disaster. 41 Miners lost their lives on February 5, 1924 when a mine shaft collapsed, allowing mud and water to flood the mine. In the corner of the parking lot, near the information kiosk, walk towards the pavilion and take the second path on your right. The path leads to a boardwalk with the names of the miners that perished engraved in the wood. Locate the information sign, approximately 325 feet from the parking lot. According to the information sign titled "Milford Lake: Then & Now" what was the original name of the lake permanently changed in size and shape after the Milford Mine disaster?

CUY 46.4777 -93.9760 **25 PTS**

Corner of 4th St. and Curtis Ave., Ironton

The Cuyuna Range Miners Memorial was erected in honor and memory of the men who lost their lives in the Cuyuna Range Mines. According to the information sign (with photo) just to the right of the memorial, what is the date of the presentation of the Joseph H. Holms Safety Certificate to employees of the Armour **No. 1** Mine?

MINNESOTA MINING (CONTINUED)

CFT 46.4895 -93.9507 **50 PTS**

Croft Mine Historical Park at the west end of 8th Ave. NE (dead end street), Crosby

Although the Croft Mine Historical Park is permanently closed and fenced off, there are a few artifacts of bygone mining days visible from the street. One of the artifacts is an old mining truck. The brand name is stamped on the front end, just above the grill. What is the brand? If you're interested, there is a wrinkled historic marker on a pole at the end of the street that describes the Croft Mine operation in detail.

POR 46.495453 -93.963908 **55 PTS**

17951 Ct. Rd. 30, Crosby

Portsmouth Mine Lake, formerly Portsmouth Pit, is the deepest lake completely within Minnesota. Once rich with manganiferous iron ore, a type of iron ore that contains significant amounts of manganese in addition to iron, is valuable for hardening steel. It was especially important during World Wars 1 and 2. In 1957, before the pit filled with water, it was the launch site of the Man High Stratospheric Balloon Flight experiment for the Air Force. Today it's known for trout fishing and scuba diving in its crystal clear depths. According to the sign next to the boat launch, what is the maximum depth?

PARKS & RECREATION

555 POINTS

Ask your dog if he wants to go to the park, and see how he reacts! Parks are a great source of getting back to nature, people watching and recreation of many types. Who doesn't love a good park?

19161 Haven Rd., Little Falls

At Belle Prairie Park in Little Falls, find the three information signboards overlooking the Mississippi River. According to the signboard titled "Little Falls" what years marked the golden era of logging?

RRP 46.3424 -94.2145 **30 PTS**

Rotary Riverside Park, E. River Rd., Brainerd

At Rotary Riverside Park in Brainerd, there is a wooden lookout platform that is part of the Mississippi River History Tour. Walk out onto the wooden lookout platform where you can see the concrete weights that are holding down the plastic culvert that was used to discharge treated sewage into the river. According to the information sign, what years was treated sewage discharged into the Mississippi River at this location?

18027 Whitetail St., Crosby

Trommald, incorporated in 1917 was deeply rooted in the Cuyuna Iron Range mining industry. Today it's all but a ghost town. Take a photo of your bike in front of the green Trommald Park sign with the historic Trommald water tower in the background.

13872 Mission Park Dr., Merrifield

The tree-lined Mission Park has everything! Pickleball courts, baseball diamond, basketball court, picnic pavilion and a playground. On the day this bonus was scouted, there were no less than 6 volunteers maintaining the grounds. This 39-acre park was sold in 1959 to Mission Township. According to the information kiosk near the sidewalk, what was the cost per acre in 1959?

ISCREAM YOUSCREAM

It is said that ice cream is happiness condensed. Scoop up some happiness one cone at a time.

VIC 46.4823 -93.9554 **25 PTS**

124 W. Main St., Crosby

The small city of Crosby has reinvented itself more than once. Originally a mining town at the turn of the last century, then in the 1960s - 1980s was the home of Scorpion Snowmobiles. And now it caters to off road bicycling, featuring upscale restaurants, retail shops and boutiques. Which describes Victual to a "T". Delicious ice cream and other gourmet grocery items. Take a photo of the mural on the east side of the Victual building.

FRO 46.9863 -94.2114 **75 PTS**

1485 Cty. Rd. 5, Longville

Frosty's Ice Cream and Pizza Parlor is a busy place on Saturdays in the summer. We won't make you go inside. Take a photo of the turtle statue atop a pedestal on the sidewalk in front of Frosty's.

681 U.S. Hwy 10, Motley

The Silo Ice Cream Parlor seems to be a bit run down looking, and they serve Kemps ice cream. While there's nothing wrong with Kemps, you can buy it in any grocery store. The lot is full of curiosities, including an animal mounted high atop a pole. What animal is it?

TRI 46.3668 -94.1777 **20 PTS**

714 Mill Ave., Brainerd

The Triangle Drive Inn ice cream stop has been serving up treats on Mill Avenue since 1962 and is a popular spot in Brainerd. They even have a Pup-A-Treat (for Dogs)! According to the price list on the front window, how much does the Pup-A-Treat cost?

TOWER OF POWER

290 POINTS

Things aren't always what they seem, even really tall things! Check out these tall towers in the surrounding area... we promise not to make you climb to the top.

CEL 46.354913 -94.343626 **20 PTS**

12440 Little Pine Rd. SW, Brainerd

Called a monopine, cell towers are often disguised to look like pine trees to improve their aesthetics. We have one such monopine near rally headquarters. Take a photo of this super tall and straight pine tree!

BOB 46.6035 -94.3143 **25 PTS**

Tower Square & Front St., Pequot Lakes

The Pequot Lakes water tower has been described as Paul Bunyan's bobber and it's very iconic to the area. Stand waaaaay back to take a photo of this water tower and make sure to capture PEQUOT LAKES painted on the side of it.

BWT 46.357880 -94.200432 **25 PTS**

624 Washington St., Brainerd

Built in 1918, the Brainerd water tower was the first all-concrete elevated tank used by a municipality in the U.S. It was replaced in 1960, but remains standing as an icon of the town. It is often referred to as Paul Bunyan's cup or flashlight by the locals. According to one of the two markers on the west side of the water tower (next to the sidewalk), what was the date of the dedication after the tower was renovated?

PMT 46.6041 -94.2943 **40 PTS**

5230 Cty. Rd. 11, Pequot Lakes

The Paul M. Thiede Fire Tower Park is a popular park with informational signs, a picnic shelter and a path leading to the base of the fire tower. The views are pretty spectacular. From the parking lot, follow the paved path approx. 275 feet to the picnic shelter. On the far side of the shelter, locate the informational sign titled "Recognition and Fame for The Pequot Lakes Fire Tower" that tells the story of Caroline Monson's 1992 encounter with a large black bear while climbing the steps of the fire tower. According to the sign, what was the name of the pet bear owned by Police Chief Mark Forsberg and encountered by Caroline near the top of the fire tower?

The Brainerd Lakes Area is chock full of beautiful golf courses.

Apparently some folks feel about golf the way we feel about motorcycles.

GRN 46.7282 -93.9875 **55 PTS**

39966 Refuge Rd., Emily

The Emily Greens Golf Course boasts having "The World's Largest Green." It's possible to have a 165 ft. putt. Go into the Emily Greens clubhouse and ask for a scorecard. Make sure to bring it to the scoring table.

MAD 46.3962 -94.3744 **55 PTS**

11266 Pine Beach Peninsula, East Gull Lake

Scotsman James Dalgeish designed the Madden's East Golf Course in 1926 and it is home to a 618-yard Par 6 hole. This is Minnesota's only Par 6. Go into the Pro Shop at The Golf Club at Madden's and ask for a Pine Beach East golf course scorecard. Make sure to bring the scorecard to the scoring table.

PIT 46.4015 -94.3262 **55 PTS**

17300 Gull River Rd., Brainerd

Stop in and say "hi" to Chuck at the Gravel Pit Golf Course. Chuck is one of the owners of this very unique golf course, built out of a working gravel pit. Ask for a scorecard from the Gravel Pit Golf Course and bring it to the scoring table.

HOT DAM!

537 POINTS

Dams matter! The dam in Crosslake created the entire Whitefish Chain and the unconventional dam in Pine River may be one of the coolest we've ever seen!

PRD 46.721570 -94.400354 **30 PTS**

450 River St., Pine River

The original concrete dam was replaced in 2022 with a "Rock Riffle". Basically, boulders placed in such a way as to slow the river down without blocking fish from traveling upstream. It also greatly reduced the chance for flooding in the area. Darndest thing I've ever seen. Take a photo of the Pine River Rock Riffle Dam.

JGP 45.9758 -94.3668 **75 PTS**

223 Kidder Street SE, Little Falls

From the parking lot of James Green Park, follow the sidewalk toward the Little Falls Dam and locate the information kiosk sign titled "LOG DRIVES." The easiest way for early lumbermen to move logs downstream was to float them down rivers in a "log drive." This was a dirty, dangerous job and Little Falls saw many log drives between 1834 and 1919. According to the information sign, what were the men called who worked the log drives?

CLD 46.669268 -94.112396 **40 PTS**

Cty. Rd. 3 in the Crosslake Recreation Area, Crosslake

This old-school dam located in Crosslake, on the Pine River, about 18 river miles above the confluence of the Pine and Mississippi rivers. The original timber dam dates from 1884 and put into operation in 1886. According to the marker (made of brick, on the walking path over the dam) the dam was dedicated on July 4, 1976 to the memory of what group?

CLASSIC CAMPFIRE TREATS

338 POINTS

How "Up North" is that?! Mmmmm, S'mores.......

SMC 46.669219 - 94.111251 **30 PTS**

35507 Cty. Rd. 66

At the Crosslake Recreation Area, next to the roundabout and across the street from the Crosslake Welcome Center, are TWO S'mores benches and we want you to take a photo of BOTH of them. Coordinates are to the bench on the south. Hang your flag on the seatback, take a photo then walk down the curvy path to the second bench and do the same.

SMM 46.698280 - 94.116647 **20 PTS**

37627 Cty. Rd. 66, Crosslake

This S'mores bench is located on the lower level of the lake side of the Moonlite Bay restaurant. Did you know? Moonlite Bay serves a S'more Martini. Now that might be my kind of cocktail! Hang your flag on the seatback of the bench and take a photo.

SMP 46.718292 - 94.403287 **20 PTS**

Just south of Barclay, on 1st Street, Pine River

Located just south of Barclay (Hwy. 84) on 1st St. is a S'mores bench. Clearly out of place and not in front of a business related to food or sweets. Show this bench some love by hanging your flag on the seatback and taking a photo.

SMY 46.675908 - 94.108579 **20 PTS**

36084 Ct. Rd. 66, Crosslake

Just a few feet south of the entrance to The Yellow House is the location of this iconic S'mores bench. Again, hang your flag on the seatback of the bench and take a photo.

SMJ 46.632705 - 94.324164 **20 PTS**

33039 Old Hwy. 371, Pequot Lakes

Between the A-Pine Restaurant and the gas station next door, you will find yet another S'mores bench. Hang your flag on seatback and take a photo to complete this sweet treat combo. Did you know? The A-Pine Restaurant serves S'more Pie, S'more Pancakes and S'more Hot Chocolate!

FLYING HIGH

711 POINTS

While Brainerd is the only city with scheduled airline service, several communities in the Brainerd Lakes Area have municipal airports allowing easy access to local resorts and cabins. That's the life!

AIT 46.5448 -93.6774 **45 PTS**

1190 Air Park Dr., Aitkin

At the Aitkin Airport, pull up to the entrance gate slowly. It will open and close on its own, allowing you to enter the airport grounds. To the right of the FBO (office building) and just beyond the fence is a "compass rose" painted on the tarmac that was painted by the Ninety-Nines, an international organization of women pilots. Hang your flag on the fence and take a photo of the blue and white compass rose.

EGL 46.3852 -94.3749 **10 PTS**

1644 Pine Beach Rd., East Gull Lake

The East Gull Lake Airport shares a packed gravel parking lot with the Madden's driving range. Park your motorcycle in the lot and walk over to the back of the only "building" around. According to the information sign at this small grass strip airport, what is the elevation?

PRA 46.727267 -94.387191 **30 PTS**

1340 MN Hwy. 84, Pine River

According to the sign for Pine River Regional Airport, what name is the airport also known as?

LFA 45.9522 -94.3471 **70 PTS**

13129 Airport Rd., Little Falls

Little Falls was Charles Lindbergh's boyhood home and the Little Falls-Morrison County Airport is known as Charles A. Lindbergh Field. Locate the flagpole with a granite marker at the base in honor of the 70th anniversary of Lindbergh's transatlantic New York to Paris solo flight. According to the marker, what was the date of that flight?

BRD 46.392961 -94.139694 **25 PTS**

16326 Airport Rd., Brainerd

Just to the south of the terminal at the Brainerd Airport is a mural painted on the north side of a tan building. What is the "N" number on the Lake Buccaneer (seaplane) depicted in the mural?

LARGER THAN LIFE

955 POINTS

We're not sure how large a serpent really is, but the serpent in today's rally does seem really big. One thing's for sure... these statues are easy to spot.

NEV 46.9644 -94.8422 **35 PTS**

114 Bunyan Trails Rd., Nevis

The World's Largest Tiger Muskie was created in 1949 by artist Warren P. Ballard and is displayed along Bunyan Trails Road in Nevis. You can't miss it! Take a photo of the tiger muskie.

HAK 46.9310 -94.5229 **55 PTS**

108 Fleisher Ave., Hackensack

On the shores of Birch Lake in Hackensack, you'll find Paul Bunyan's sweetheart Lucette Diana Kensack. Lucette was created in 1950 by Doad Schroeder, named in 1951 after a national contest then celebrated on June 27th, 1952 with the first Paul Bunyan Sweetheart Festival. Take a photo of the big gal and include your motorcycle.

SER 46.4792 -93.9554 **25 PTS**

Franklin Park, 3rd St. SW, Crosby

On the shores of Serpent Lake in Crosby, you'll find a giant Sea Serpent statue. At 20 feet high and 25 feet long, we sure hope it's larger than life! This serpent's name is Kahnah' bek, which is said to mean "serpent" in Ojibwe. Take a photo of this colorful statue.

OTT 46.3727 -95.6532 **60 PTS**

28255 N. Midway Park Dr., Battle Lake

Otter Tail Beach Resort was previously owned by fellow rally riders and is a great place for a family vacation on the southeast side of Otter Tail Lake. The large walleye statue at the entrance is a big hint of the type of fish you might catch while fishing on the lake. Take a photo of the large walleye at the entrance to Otter Tail Beach Resort.

DER 46.4736 -93.8991 **20 PTS**

23791 Front St. (on the south side of Hwy. 210), Deerwood

Welcome to Deerwood! This classic leaping deer statue has been welcoming visitors and residents to Deerwood for many years. Take a photo of the deer statue.

WHAT ARE THEY NOW?

706 POINTS

As this area was settled and rural towns were established, creameries were the first businesses opened so the local farmers had a place to deliver their goods. Today, most of the creameries have fallen by the wayside and the buildings have been repurposed.

CQS 46.092632 -94.505494 **35 PTS**

120 Superior Ave., Randall

The Old Creamery Quilt Shop. Once upon a time this place was churning butter. Now they make and sell quilts and other upscale items. Take a photo of the RANDALL CREAMERY sign above the door.

NYM 46.517622 -95.374786 **60 PTS**

102 E. Centennial Dr., New York Mills

Like most of the creameries, New York Mills Creamery has reinvented itself. What is the business occupying the former creamery building now called? (I can attest to the quality of their products.)

OTC 46.4264 -95.5579 **55 PTS**

107 W. Main St., Ottertail

The Ottertail Creamery was built in 1921 in the heart of downtown Ottertail. Originally a slaughterhouse, later a creamery that manufactured 353,839 pounds of butter. The original building was renovated in 2009 and is now home to a church, boutique and coffee shop. Park your motorcycle in front of the brick building and take a photo showing OTTERTAIL CREAMERY in the limestone.

SEB 46.630091 -95.097958 **50 PTS**

686 W. Minnesota St., Sebeka

Once the second largest creamery in Minnesota, the Sebeka Creamery saw significant growth, churning out 158,003 pounds of butter in 1909 and exceeding 1 million pounds by 1926. Like all but a few of the creameries in small-town America, the Sebeka Creamery is closed and the building has been repurposed. What is the name of the company currently doing business in the Sebeka Co-operative Creamery Association building?

AS FAST AS A SPEEDING TURTLE

776 POINTS

Slow and steady wins the race, literally.

LTR 46.9864 -94.2119 **50 PTS**

1st St. N., Longville (just outside of Frosty's Ice Cream)

Longville claims to be the Turtle Race Capital of the World and this town has held turtle races since the 1960s. Races are held downtown every Wednesday from June through August. At the center of town, on Main Street, you'll find the Turtle Race Track painted on the street itself. Place your flag next to the start circle and take a photo of the "race track."

NTR 46.5215 -94.2889 **25 PTS**

25532 Main St., Nisswa (behind the Nisswa Chamber of Commerce building)

The 62nd season of Turtle Races just wrapped up in Nisswa. Locate the race track on the street, lay your flag on the finish line and take a photo.

PTR 46.593916 -95.572059 **65 PTS**

185 E. Main St., Perham

Turtle Races are held in Perham every Wednesday in June-July-August at Turtle Race Park, next to the Perham Area Chamber of Commerce.
